Stepping into the Bicentenary

The 199th Foundation Day (Inauguration of the Bicentenary) on dated 6th October 2020

The Deccan College commemorated its 199th Foundation Day (Inauguration of the Bicentenary) by organising an online programme on dated 6th October 2020. The programme began with an invocation and the Deccan College song. In his welcome address, the Vice Chancellor (Acting) of the institute, Prof. Prasad Joshi, spoke of the important transitions in the history of the College. He highlighted the significant contribution of the College in each of these phases to the dissemination of knowledge and learning. He also talked about the institute's resolve to further raise the standards of its contribution to research and to increase the outreach of its activities so as to take this research culture beyond academic circles to the common people. To this end the Deccan College will introduce new courses, conduct workshops and training programmes. He also referred to the New Education Policy and said that the Deccan College was prepared to play a significant role in its implementation. The

former Chancellor of the Deccan College, Dr. G.B. Deglurkar blessed the gathering on this occasion and urged the University Grants Commission and the Ministry of Human Resources to confer on the Deccan College the status of a Central University. The vice-chairman of the University Grants Commission of India, Dr. Bhushan Patwardhan was the chief guest at the programme. He observed that, given the long tradition of heritage studies and its status as a postgraduate research institute, the Deccan College was equipped to redefine the conventional understanding of the term 'university'. He suggested that the Deccan College could initiate courses in research methodology for culture studies, heritage studies and the humanities. He further suggested that the Deccan College should endeavour to become a model central university for indigenous knowledge systems. Dr. Patwardhan assured the institute of his support to realise this dream. The Chancellor of the Deccan College, Dr. A.P. Jamkhedkar presided over the function. He said the institute was determined to further strengthen its research output and to engage in collaborative research to this end. Importantly, he observed that the Deccan College is poised to lead the way in the inter-disciplinary areas of research such as the Digital Humanities, bridging the traditional domains of the humanities, heritage studies and technology. Dr. Amrita Sarkar compered the programme, Dr. Abhijit Dandekar introduced the guests and Prof. Sonal Kulkarni-Joshi presented the vote of thanks. The programme ended with the singing of the national song. Alumni, well-wishers, special invitees, present and former staff and students of the Deccan College attended the online programme in large numbers to witness this historic occasion.

About the Workshop:

In the early period of the first millennium BCE, there developed a tradition of language analysis in India with a purpose to preserve the sacred language of the Vedas. It included the study of Chandas (metres), Nirukta (word explication), Śikṣā (phonetics), Prātiśākhya (phonology), Padapāṭha (word analysis), and Vyākaraṇa (grammar). Pānini in his Astādhyāyī (circa 4th C BCE) provided a comprehensive

linguistic description of the Sanskrit language prevalent at his time which included a set of rules and exceptions of generative nature. Model of Pāṇini inspired the later grammarians to develop more or less similar models with different purposes including Pali and Prakrit grammars also. The tradition of language study flourished in many branches. The three chief disciplines of Nyāya, Mīmāmsā and Vyākaraṇa primarily dealt with the nature of word and its meaning. They described the process of meaning comprehension from the utterance. Recent decades have experienced growing interest of computer scientists in the ancient linguistic tradition of India for various reasons. A range of tools and applications is being developed in IITs and universities to facilitate preparation of critical editions, translations and such other research activities. The objective of this workshop was to provide glimpses of the knowledge system of the linguistic tradition of India conveyed in the early oral and written medium and also in today's digital form, and to develop the ability in the participants that they will be able to apply their learning to practical tasks in the field of Sanskrit studies and Natural Language Processing.

About the Workshop:

Before the discovery of the Harappan Civilization it was thought by many scholars that there is a gap in the cultural history of South Asia and that the settled life in this part took place only in the 6th century BCE. The discovery has not only bridged the so-called cultural gap but also in one stroke established that the settled life in this part was pushed back by more than two thousand years. Continuous research activities for the past one hundred years have enabled us to understand many facets of this great Civilization. This workshop on Harappan Culture: New Dimensions and Paradigm Shift hold an account of new scientific discoveries and researches carried out by archaeologists since the time of discovery of the Harappan site of over a century ago. The workshop was conducted as a series of lectures focusing on paradigm shift in Harappan studies from traditional understanding of material culture to analytical and interpretative approach. More often archaeology is stigmatized to be a fact-centric subject in nature but this workshop aimed at a new approach to help understand the story and facts behind the origin and gradual development of the Harappan

Civilization. Topics related to achievements of the Harappan Civilization in the field of basic sciences and technologies, were discussed at large. The contributions this Civilization has made to the history of South Asia and the world along with its relevance to contemporary society was been explored in this workshop. This workshop was designed for professionals, students and layman. It not only incorporated latest data and hypothesis about overall lifestyle including social, religious, political organizations, material culture but also analysed interpretations of scientific data to understand their health, diet and authors of the culture.
