

The Deccan College, Post-Graduate and Research Institute, Deemed University, the third oldest educational Institute in the country established on 6 October 1821 is presently ranked 40th amongst the top 45 Universities of the country and 11th in terms of reputation. This is the only University in the country specializing in past and present Heritage of the country and is globally reputed for quality teaching and research in the specialized fields. The University has three full-fledged Departments, namely Archaeology, Linguistics and Sanskrit and Lexicography. The credit of establishing Archaeology and Linguistics into a University system for the first time in the country goes to Deccan College.

The Deccan College, Deemed University is culturally rooted in the Indian civilization of values; where knowledge is pursued for excellence, economic upliftment and social justice. The University upholds the motto सं श्रतेन गमेमहि meaning 'may we be united with knowledge'. It is here that narrow barriers are broken to pursue the vision of one world. Students from all over the country and world are welcome here. It is a matter of great satisfaction to us all that our students spread the knowledge and wisdom that we teach them, which is embedded in our rich texts and material culture, to all of humanity for a better present and future.

The Department of Archaeology of this University is one of the biggest and most well-known in the world. Students and staff of this Department carry out research all over the country and outside and not only generate primary sources for writing history but also provide economic opportunities for all classes of the society. Under one roof, the Department has eight different labs required for carrying out basic scientific archaeological research. The Department acts as a National centre for basic research in heritage related subjects. Considering the academic contribution and its commitment to participate in Nation Building, the Department of Archaeology is recognized as Centre of Advanced Study since 1985. The Department of Linguistics studies the origin and development of four major language families and scores of dialects spoken in South Asia.

Recently, the UGC has provided Special Assistance Programme (SAP) to this Department, which is enabling it to reclaim its past glory gradually. The recently established Department of Sanskrit and Lexicography is teaching not only traditional knowledge system but also the art of dictionary making, which is fading away fast from the world. This project of Encyclopaedic Dictionary of Sanskrit based on historical principles, being run by this Department since 1948, is unique in the entire world as it is seeking to understand meaning of different words changing with time and space. It has developed a huge scriptorium of over 10 million slips of references, which serves as a basic source of Dictionary writing in the entire world.

The University has a very rich and well furnished Library, which is the best in the country for subjects related to the heritage studies. The collection numbers over 1.75 lakh publications, includes research reports and books, manuscripts, journals, encyclopaedias, reference and textbooks. The University publishes its Annual Reports and Research Bulletin annually. The Annual Reports provide glimpses of research and academic activities being carried out by the University in a particular year. The Bulletin of the University mainly includes original results of the research activities carried out by the faculty and research staff.

As a leader in Heritage studies in the world, a number of Universities and Education organizations are keen to establish research collaborations with Deccan College. In the past, well known foreign Universities like Cambridge, Pennsylvania, California, Berkeley, the International Research Centre for Japanese Studies, Kyoto, Japan, Research Institute for Humanity and Nature, Kyoto, Japan, etc. have had research collaborations with this University. Presently, the Seoul National University Medical College and the Tata Institute of Fundamental Research are collaborating on the study of Ancient Population and archaeo-astronomy respectively.

The University is planning to open a number of new Departments such as Maratha History, Museum Studies, Heritage Management and Tourism, etc. and establish a Heritage Park on its vast 115 acre campus for public education and preservation of Traditional Knowledge Systems, which is still very much relevant to the entire South Asia. We are aiming to make this University the National and World leader in the preservation and conservation of humanity's rich cultural heritage and values and play significant role in Nation Building.

About Deccan College



Deccan College, Post-Graduate and Research Institute, Pune is the third oldest Educational Institute in India. The Hindoo College was founded on 6th October, 1821 by the Bombay Presidency Government at the initiative of its Governor, Mountstuart Elphinstone by using the Dakshina Fund, which was started initially by Khanderao Dabhade, a Maratha Sardar and continued by the Peshwas for propagating Sanskrit studies. This College grew from strength to strength and has emerged as one of the foremost Institutes of higher learning and research in the world. It was renamed as the Poona College on 7th June, 1851 and later as the Deccan College in October 1864. The Deccan College was shifted to a new campus covering an area of 115 acres near Yerawada on 23rd March 1868. With the help of a munificent grant of one lakh Rupees, donated by Sir Jamsetji Jejeebhoy, the main building of the College was built in a beautiful Gothic style. The Deccan College, since then, has produced a number of students who rose to positions of excellence in various walks of life. They include Sir Ramkrishna Gopal Bhandarkar, the celebrated Indologist, Lokmanya Bal Gangadhar Tilak, the great nationalist leader, Gurudev Ramchandra Dattatreya Ranade, the eminent philosopher, Gopal Ganesh Agarkar, the great social reformer, Vishwanath Kashinath Rajwade, the famous historian, Dr. Dwarkanath Kotnis, the famous Indian medical

practitioner who rendered yeomans' service in China, etc. The College was closed down by the British Government in 1934, but thanks to the efforts of the past students association and public spirited citizens, it was reopened on 17th August 1939 as Deccan College, Post-Graduate and Research Institute, by the Transfer Deed passed by the Hon'ble Bombay High Court. As per the Transfer Deed, the State Government was asked to run the Institute in perpetuity. In the next half-century, the University, apart from giving instruction to Postgraduate students and producing a large number of Ph.D. Dissertations, has carried out outstanding research in Ancient Indian History, Culture and Archaeology, Linguistics, Medieval and Maratha History, Sociology, Anthropology and Sanskrit studies. Eminent scholars such as the late Professors S. M. Katre, H. D. Sankalia, Irawati Karve, C. R. Sankaran, T. S. Shejwalkar, and their colleagues and successors such as Professors A. M. Ghatage, M. A. Mehendale, S. B. Deo, M. K. Dhavalikar, etc., as well as the students enrolled from within and outside the country, made first-rate teaching and research contributions. In recognition of the excellence achieved by the Institute both in teaching and research, the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, awarded it the status of a Deemed University in 1990. The Institute started functioning as a Deemed University from the academic year 1994-95. Since then the University has conducted its own courses for M.A. and P.G. Diploma in Archaeology and M.A. degree

in Linguistics, and has also enrolled a large number of students for the Ph.D. degree in these disciplines. From the academic year 2010-11 the Deemed University has started a new Department of Sanskrit and Lexicography. Side by side, the University has continued its research activity in various branches of Archaeology, Linguistics, Sanskrit and Maratha History. As a result of the quality of research and teaching, the Department of Archaeology has been given a special status of Centre of Advanced Study (CAS). Recently the UGC has offered Special Assistance Programme (SAP) to the Department of Linguistics.

The Government of India has from time to time honoured various scholars (both staff and students) for rendering service in Indian Culture.



The Departments







The University has three teaching-cum-research Departments: 1. Ancient Indian History, Culture and Archaeology, 2. Linguistics, and 3. Sanskrit and Lexicography. The Department of Archaeology is the premier centre for teaching and research in archaeology in Asia, consisting of faculty expertise in Ancient Indian History, Culture and Archaeology, and related scientific branches including Biological Anthropology, Geoarchaeology, Palynology, Palaeobotany, Palaeontology, Archaeozoology, Archaeological Chemistry and Computer Science. It has generated primary sources, through excavations and explorations, for reconstructing past life ways and traditions. The Department of Linguistics is the

pioneering Department for developing modern linguistics in India. It works on the origins of three major language families and numerous dialects in the country. The Department of Sanskrit and Lexicography is only of its kind in the country which combines both the branches of Sanskrit and Lexicography. The Encyclopaedic Sanskrit Dictionary Project based on Historical Principles forms an integral part of this Department. It has a huge scriptorium housing more than 10 million references extracted from the entire gamut of Sanskrit literature. The University has produced 254 Ph.D. theses till date thus contributing to the research in Indian culture.

Laboratories and Museums

The Departments of Archaeology and Linguistics have several essential aboratories established under one roof. The Department of Archaeology is unique in the world as it has a Faculty dealing with different aspects of cultural heritage and scientific archaeology and is considered the second best in the world in terms of archaeological infrastructure and research output, next only to the Institute of Archaeology, London. The vast amount of archaeological data including artefacts and ecofacts are scientifically processed and analysed in the labs of the University. They include Palaeontology, Geomorphology, Palynology, Physical Anthropology, Archaeobotany, Archaeozoology, Computer Archaeology, X-Ray Diffraction and Archaeolosical Chemistry. The Department is also in the process of establishing Isotope Analysis Labs, which will come up within one year. These labs are maintained and run by trained manpower and they cater to the needs of the Department as well as the country. The Department of Linguistics has a LAN based interactive language laboratory equipped with

software such as Multispeech, Praat and Wavesurfer. The laboratory is used to complement class room teaching in Phonetics and Applied Linguistics and also short term courses conducted by the Department. The University has two museums - I. Archaeology and 2. Maratha History. The Museum of Archaeology has ten galleries devoted to the Late Professor H. D. Sankalia's Memorabilia, Prehistory, Protohistory, Iron Age and Early Historic, Sculptures, Medieval Archaeology, Numismatics and Epigraphy, Science in Archaeology and Ethnoarchaeology. Recently the Maritime Society of India has established a gallery in the Archaeology Museum depicting maritime history of the country. The Maratha History Museum houses the archival records and antiquities bequeathed by Rao Bahadur D. B. Parasnis of Satara and Maharaja of Jamkhindi. The museum has two sections: Archives and Armoury and Art Collection. Both these museums are also used for teaching and research purpose as well as are open to the public.



Library





The Deccan College Library is the best library for cultural heritage related studies in the country. It has over 1.7 lakh books, several specialised collections, and over 12000 rare manuscripts. It receives nearly 400 journals by subscription and exchange. Computerization of book collection and installation of INFLIBNET facilities have progressed with financial assistance from the UGC. Many researchers from within and outside the country visit this University for reference work in their studies.



Publication



The University has a separate publication section and an elaborate programme of publishing research contributions since 1940. It publishes the Research Bulletin, Annual Report and at least one part of the Sanskrit Dictionary annually. So far this University has published around 250 titles in Archaeology, Anthropology, Sociology, Linguistics, Medieval History, Sanskrit and related subjects.



For Indian Candidates

Candidates seeking admission to M.A. course shall apply on a prescribed form. The application form duly filled in by the candidate in his or her own hand and a passport size photo affixed together with attested copies of the documents listed below, must reach the Asstt. Registrar, Academic Section of the Institute by 10th June.

NOTE:

- Application incomplete in any sense will not be considered for admission.
- If the final degree examination result is not declared by the date of application, the candidate shall submit statement of marks of previous year degree examination.

Admission to the course will initially remain provisional. It will be confirmed when all the documents specified below are submitted and accepted. A notice for the submission of eligibility application alongwith the documents mentioned below will be issued after the provisional admission process is over. Failure to submit the documents at that time will be viewed seriously by the authorities and action will be taken as per the rules against the defaulting student.



Having been found prima facie eligible for admission to the course, the student will be given a provisional admission letter by which he/she can obtain Students Visa for study at this Institute. (A student will not be admitted to the course without a proper Students Visa).

On obtaining the Students Visa the candidate shall arrive at the Deccan College and submit the eligibility application along with original and photocopies of the certificates listed above as also the Students Visa.

The medium of instruction for all these courses at the Institute is English. It is therefore essential that the student has sound knowledge of English. To test this the student shall appear for Proficiency Test in English Language. Only those students who pass the test shall be admitted to the course. The following students shall be exempted from appearing for the test:

- Who are native speakers of English language.
- Who are seeking admission through the Government of India Scholarship Scheme (ICCR Scholarship holders).
- Who have migrated from an Indian University and have passed the English Language Test of that University.
- Who have passed the test conducted by this Institute during their admission to an earlier degree/diploma course at this Institute.

Foreign students will have to undergo a medical check-up at a medical centre to be specified by the Institute. Only those students who are found medically fit will be admitted to the course.

Examination, Evaluation & Terms of Passing

Examination and Evaluation

A minimum of 75 percent attendance at lectures, laboratory work and field work in each paper will be necessary for qualifying to appear in the examination. The examination for each semester shall consist of :

- A) Internal Assessment, and
- B) University Examination.

The ratio of (A) and (B) shall be 20:80 marks.

Internal Assessment

Internal Assessment, for each paper, will consist of : Home assignment/ Class test/ Field or Laboratory report - 20 Marks.

University Examination

The University Examination will consist of a written test of 80 marks for each paper except dissertation.

Terms of Passing

To be eligible to pass in a paper a student should secure minimum pass marks, i.e. 40% marks (Internal Assessment and University examination marks taken together).

NOTE:

Examination for the backlog papers of a semester will be held only when that particular semesterend examination is being held for regular students.

A student will be permitted to carry over a backlog of not more than two papers to the next semester. However, in exceptional cases the Departmental Committee may waive this condition and permit the student to enroll for the next semester.

Payment & Refund of Fees

I. PAYMENT OF FEES

The fees prescribed for last semester / Instalment / Examination etc. shall be paid in full. Part payment of these fees will not be accepted.

All fees shall be paid, by the due date (together with late fee, where specified), in the D.C. extension counter of the Central Bank of India. (Monday to Friday: 10.30-2.30 Saturday 10.30-12.30). Foreign students may pay the fees prescribed in USDollars, in equivalent Indian Rupees.

Failure to pay the prescribed fees by the due date will lead to cancellation of admission to the course / hostel and / or exclusion from appearing in the examination / or payment of fine as prescribed.

- Indian Student: Within Maharashtra (WM): Passed qualifying exam from a University within Maharashtra.
 / Domicile of Maharashtra.
- Outside Maharashtra (OM):Passed qualifying exam from a University outside Maharashtra.
- US \$800- for foreign students who have migrated from a foreign University & US \$500 for foreign students who have migrated from Indian University.

II. REFUND OF FEES

If a student decides to discontinue the course after paying all the fees, the tuition and other compulsory fees will be refunded, after deducting 25% of the total amount of these fees paid, towards administrative charges, provided he/she submits a written application within one month (30 days) from the date he/she takes admission to the course. Application for refund shall not be considered after the due date.

Library and Hostel deposits will be refunded after the student submits No Dues Certificates from the Librarian and the Estate Office.

Eligibility Criteria for Ph.D.

Archaeology -

- M.A. in A.I.H.C. and Archaeology or M.A. Archaeology or Masters in any branch of Archaeology (such as Prehistory, Protohistory, Ancient Studies, Bioarchaeology, Scientific Archaeology, Indology, Anthropology) OR M.Sc.in Anthropology /Geography/Geology/Zoology/ Botany / Physics / Chemistry with a minimum of 55% marks or B+ or an equivalent grade of a recognized University. Relaxation may be made as regards the percentage of marks by 5% in case of Reserved Categories (SC, ST, PH).
- Students having M.A. Degree in a subject other than Ancient Indian History, Culture and /or Archaeology listed in (a) above and students having a M.Sc. Degree in the subjects listed in (b) above will have successfully completed the M.Phil. course in Ancient Indian History, Culture and /or Archaeology, of any other recognized university or the P.G.Diploma course of this university.

Linguistics -

 M.A. in Linguistics or in one of the Classical or Modern Indian or foreign languages with a minimum of 55% marks or B+ or an equivalent grade of a recognized University. Relaxation may be made as regards the percentage of marks by 5% in case of Reserved Categories (SC, ST, PH). Students having M.A. Degree in a subject other than Linguistics will have successfully completed the M.Phil. course in Linguistics of any other recognized university to become eligible for admission to the Ph.D. course.

Sanskrit and Lexicography -

 M.A. in Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit with a minimum of 55% marks or B+ or an equivalent grade of a recognized University. Relaxation may be made as regards the percentage of marks by 5% in case of Reserved Categories (SC, ST, PH).



Admission Procedure for Ph.D.

Indian Candidates

A student seeking admission to Ph.D. course shall apply on a prescribed form. The application form, duly filled in by the student in his / her own hand and with a passport-size photo affixed on it along with xerox copies of the documents listed below, must be sent to the Academic Section of the Institute. Admission to the Ph.D. degree course opens once in the year (September/October).

- Migration Certificate (No objection certificate from the University last attended).
- Passing/Degree certificate of the last qualifying degree examination.
- Mark-list of the last qualifying degree examination
- Character certificate (from the head of the Institute from which the student has obtained his qualifying degree.
- Documentary proof for date of birth.
- Gap certificate (if applicable)
- Research proposal *
- No objection certificate from the employer (if employed)
 - * The Research proposal shall be prepared by the student in consultation with his proposed guide and shall be signed by both. The title of the Ph.D. thesis suggested should be such that no work of similar nature has been done or is being done. Research proposal shall consist of:

- Current status of knowledge of the topic of research;
- Aims of proposed research and methodology to be adopted;
- Nature of the data to be collected; Proposed method of analysis and interpretation; Expected contribution to the knowledge of the subject; and

A detailed bibliography of the literature on the topic of research.

NOTE: Students are requested to note that their application will not be considered for admission if the above certificates are not enclosed with their application.

- Admission to the Ph.D. programme shall be done through an Entrance Test. Students who have passed GATE/NET/SET/ M.Phil/JRF examination in the relevant subject of the apex bodies as CSIR/UGC/ICAR/ICMR/ DBT will be exempted from the Entrance Test.
- The concerned Departmental Committee may give exemption for Ph.D.entrance test and course work to a deserving candidate. While giving the exemption, the Departmental Committee may consider research work/ earlier Ph.D./experience done by the candidate. If a candidate already holds a Ph.D. degree in a related subject from a recognized



University, he/she may be exempted from entrance test and course work for admission to Ph.D.

- For entrance test there would be two papers. Paper I would be General Aptitude Test of 100 marks and Paper II would be a subject paper of 100 marks. General Aptitude Test will have 50 questions with multiple choice covering Research & Teaching Aptitude, Logical Thinking, General Comprehension, etc. The test shall be conducted by the University. The second paper of the written test will pertain to the subject concerned and the test shall be of 100 marks. (30 marks for objective type and 70 marks for descriptive type.) After passing both tests the student will appear before the Department concerned.
- Only those students who have passed the entrance test or who are exempted from entrance test shall appear for an interview to be organized by the Department concerned.
- At the time of interview, doctoral candidates are expected to discuss their research interest/ area.
- Only the predetermined number of students may be admitted to Ph.D. programme.
- While granting admission to students to Ph.D. programme, the University will pay due attention to the State Reservation Policy.

Foreign Candidates

- Having been found prima facie eligible for admission to the course, the student will be given a provisional admission letter by which he/she can obtain Research Visa for study at this Institute. The letter shall be valid for a period of one year from the date of issue.
- On receiving the Research Visa the student shall arrive at the Deccan College and shall submit the eligibility application and original and xerox copies of the certificates listed above as also the Research Visa. A student shall not be admitted to the course if he fails to submit the documents requested for.

English Language Test:

The medium of instruction for the Ph.D. degree programme at this Institute is English. It is therefore essential that the student has a sound knowledge of English Language. To test this the student shall appear for English Language Test. Only those students who pass the Test shall be admitted to the Ph.D. degree programme.

- Who have migrated from an Indian University and have passed the English Language test of that University.

- The Test shall be of two and half hours duration and shall contain objective type questions in general English and grammar. The paper will be of 100 marks. To be eligible to pass a student must secure 40 marks.

Medical Test:

 To ensure that a student admitted to the Ph.D. degree has sound health, all foreign students shall undergo a medical fitness test as detailed below. However, students who have already appeared for the medical test, conducted by this Institute, during their earlier admission to a degree course of this Institute, shall be exempted from appearing for this test. Only those students who are found medically fit shall be admitted to the Ph.D. degree programme.

For medical fitness the students shall be subjected to the following tests:

- HIV Test (Aids Test)
- Chest Check-up (through X-Ray)
- General Medical Test
- Till such time that the Institute is able to provide medical facility to carry out the above tests, they shall be done at Inlaks and Budhrani Hospital or at a hospital to be specified later. Expenditure on these tests including incidental expenses shall be made by the Institute from the medical test fees collected from the student.
- Only those students who are found medically fit shall be admitted to the Ph.D. programme.

Course Work

The Course work is compulsory and will carry 20 credits. The bifurcation of these credits is as under:

• 5 credits for Research Methodology which includes research methodology, quantitative methods, computer application, tools and techniques including instrumentation, communication skill, seminar presentation and review of published research. •10 credits for subject specific (2 subjects) course work. • 5 credits for field work, seminar and other academic activities.

The evaluation will be done by the concerned faculty of the Department.

Admitted candidates shall be required to undertake course work organized by the Department as the case may be . The course work will be for a minimum period of one semester. The course work shall be treated as pre Ph.D. preparation.

Hostel and Gymkhana Facilities

Hostel

The University provides separate accomodation for both boys and girls from outside Pune. The campus incorporates residential buildings in close proximity to the departments, library and classrooms to facilitate easy access. All rooms are well-furnished with common bathrooms. Mess facilities are also available for which separate semester-wise payment will be accrued from the respective students.

There are two hostels for boys and girls. The **two hostels** house more than **150 students** in total. The two boys' blocks are called Gents hostel No. 1 and No. 2.

Amenities

The students are provided with basic amenities like a cot, table, chair and a cupboard in their respective rooms. The rooms are spacious and airy with a full view of the lush greenery outside the block perimeter. All rooms in boy's hostel are single occupation. The hostels have a 24 hr. water supply, the sports grounds are situated at a close distance to encourage students to stay fit by regularly playing cricket, volley ball, or by taking a simple refreshing run along the tracks. Electrical repairs and security services are available round the clock.

Admission Criteria

The hostel admission is carried on first come, first served basis.

Hostel administration reserves the right to deny or cancel admission at any stage.

Gymkhana

The Institute has a gymkhana which provides opportunities to students, employees and their immediate family members for recreational and cultural activites. The facilities include outdoor games like cricket and volley ball and indoor games like badminton, table tennis, carom and chess. Recently the Gymkhana has been equipped with Treadmill and body building equipment. It also has a television and subscribes to magazines and newspapers. The Gymkhana organizes a variety of cultural activities like lectures, debate competitions, musical programmes and celebration of festivals. The Gymkhana is managed by a committee elected by its members, with a faculty member, nominated by the Director, as its chairman. The funds of the Gymkhana come from the annual grants given by the State Government to the Institute and from the subcription of its members.

Rules and Regulations

Ragging within premises is strictly prohibited.
